





Key Achievements

Advocacy and Representation:

- All Party Parliamentary Group of Cosmos UK (APPG Cosmos) is playing a vital role and developed as a Bridge between Sri Lanka and Westminster in voicing for the Sri Lankan Muslims.





- Through our meetings with notable Sri Lankan Presidents including Ranil Wickremesinghe, Maithripal Sirisena and MPs including M.A. Sumanthiran, R. Shanakiyan, Ali Sabry, G L Peiris, Wijeyadasa Rajapakshe we have addressed sensitive issues like MMDA reforms, Forced cremation, minority rights, and justice for political detainees, one country on law, PTA etc
- We presented key issues during productive discussions with the Sri Lankan High Commissioner, ensuring our concerns about the One Country One Law Task Force and other policies were heard.


Humanitarian Impact:

COSMOS UK remains deeply committed to addressing the needs of the most vulnerable.

- In partnership with the Sylvia Lanka Foundation, we coordinated shipments of life-saving medical equipment worth millions of pounds to Sri Lankan hospitals. This initiative underscores our ability to mobilise resources for impactful humanitarian causes.
- Through our support for cataract eye surgeries and other healthcare initiatives, we continue to bring essential services to underserved communities.
- We proudly co-organised the launch of *Dying While Muslim in Masked Sri Lanka and In search our roots both authored by Lukman Harees* a book that sheds light on the forced cremation saga in Sri Lanka, raising awareness and inspiring collective action and other book attempt to impart the Sri Lankan history and values to young British Sri Lankans here in UK.
- We recognised many communities' prominent contributors in arts, media and writing name to few are B H Abdul Hameed Broadcaster, Ishaq Baig Singer, Lukman Harees Writer / Author, Zara Mohamed Secretary General of MCB

Strengthening Intercommunity and International Engagement:

- Our affiliate SLIA celebrated its milestones such as 50th Anniversary.
- Independence Day events organised at the Sri Lanka High Commission and our affiliate organisations such as SLMCC Harrow, Al Furqan Luton, Masjid Al Jannah- Slough etc in fostering unity and highlighting our rich, cultural heritage to wider community.
- Our participation in events like the Westminster Abbey Independence Day celebrations and discussions on Islamophobia with Transport for London (TfL) has helped us bridge gaps,

A Call to the Next Generation




Together, we have achieved remarkable milestones. Together, we can achieve even more. Let us move forward with unity, purpose, and a renewed commitment to building a brighter future for all.



Engagement Initiatives


- **Shakeer (President)** emphasized the need for **greater engagement** from the executive committee, encouraging members to shadow him at events to enhance involvement.

- Azath (Al Furqan) and Mubarak proposed raising awareness of COSMOS among affiliate members to strengthen community ties.

Support Requests

• The **Sylvia Foundation** requested COSMOS's assistance in nominating hospitals to send medical equipment.




• Plans were made for COSMOS to meet with local associations in **Slough** and another meeting to engage with associations from **Crawley**.


The meeting commenced at **16:18** with a **Qirath** recitation by **Br. Shakeer**. •


- A **£100** sponsorship for **NM Ameen**'s paper was agreed upon, with **Br. Akram** responsible for the payment.
